Hello Chris,

I met with Jeff Shea this morning to go over our budget presentation for next week. On a side note he brought up a concern about this proposal to install speed humps on Twin Spits. I share his concerns. This road does not meet the criteria set in the policy adopted by the Board for application of these speed humps. I don't think this is a good idea. It may set a precedent we may regret. If there is a speeding problem it would be more effective for the Sheriff to address rather than putting obstacles in the middle of the road. My concern is if the humps go in here, next will be Hood Canal Dr, then Hansville Rd, etc. If the decision is to move forward with the humps on this road then we should also look at rescinding the present policy that was adopted by the Board for determining where it is appropriate to install these obstacles.
